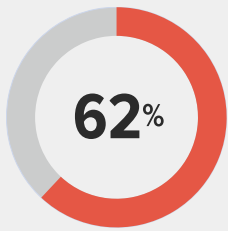

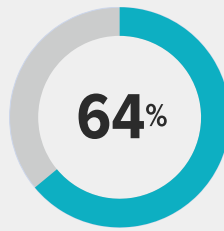
Voters Want Government to Negotiate More Trade Deals

Strong bipartisan majorities say government should negotiate more trade deals to open new markets for American-made goods and services

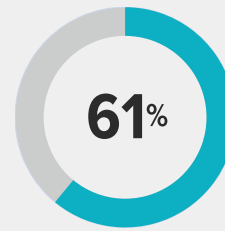
Percent of voters who say government should negotiate more trade deals:



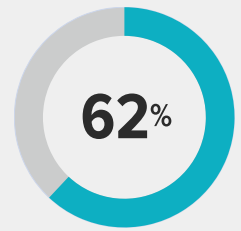

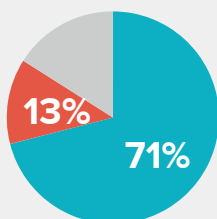
Across party lines, voters say U.S. trade with other countries is likely to...



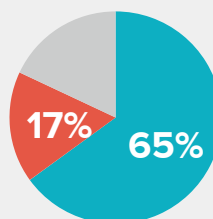

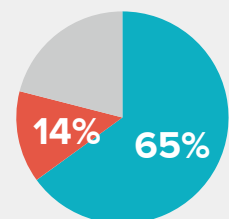
